

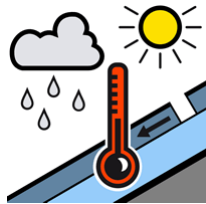

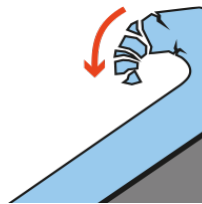

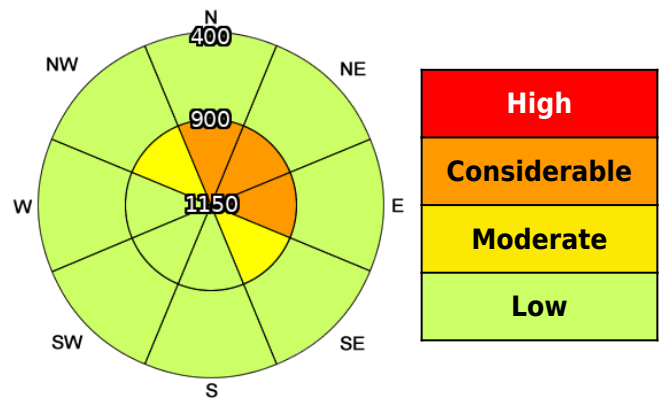

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Unstable windslab will continue to develop gaining depth and becoming more widespread in wind sheltered locations. North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres will be most affected particularly in gullies, scarp slopes and steep coire rims. Cross loading may affected other sheltered aspects. Fragile cornices will exist above these aspects. Wind exposed slopes will be scoured, icy with better stability. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The freezing level will be around 500 metres until dawn then it will slowly rise ending up above the summits by the end of the day. Snow showers overnight Sunday then dry through Monday. The very strong Westerly winds will ease briefly then strengthen becoming fresh to strong South-South- Easterly.

**Comments**

Snowpack stability will slowly improve as milder condition become established. towards the latter part of the day.
