

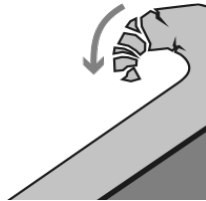

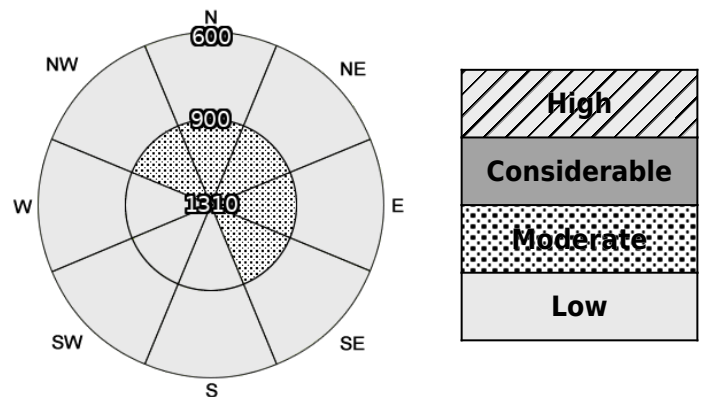
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A steady thaw at all altitudes; however, there will be potential for redistribution of lying snow. Unstable windslab will be present on North-West through North to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be in steep locations such as gully exits, coire rims and convexities. Remaining cornices will become progressively unstable, potentially triggering slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry throughout the forecast period. Strong Southerly winds will increase to gale force and back to become South-South-Easterly. Turning milder during the night as the freezing level rises to well above the summits.

Comments

Much milder temperatures over the next 24 hours, rock and ice fall a potential hazard.
