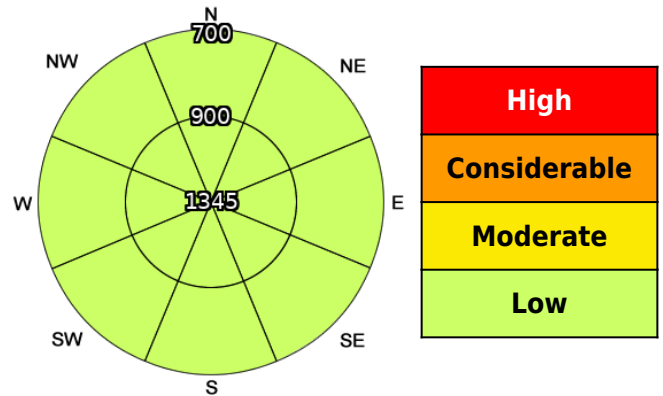
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of wind slab are expected to accumulate on North to East facing slopes above 900 metres throughout the afternoon. This will mainly affect areas such as steep corrie headwalls and gully exits. These accumulations are expected to be small and easily avoidable. Elsewhere, the snowpack will continue to consolidate and be generally firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong to gale force South to South-Westerly winds. Overnight rain showers turning to snow during the day. The freezing level is expected to lower to around 700 metres by afternoon on Thursday.
