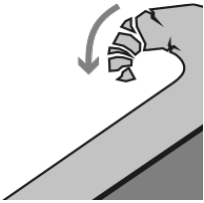


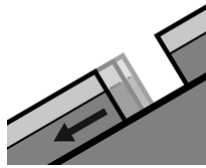

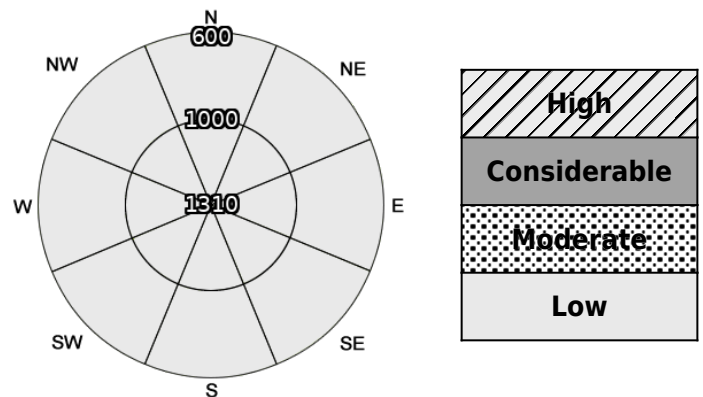

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Stability will be generally good. Recent accumulations of soft moist snow will continue to consolidate and surface layers will begin to refreeze during the day. Cornices remain a hazard. Some new snow is expected during the day and will lie above 700 metres or so but amounts are not expected to be significant. Elsewhere, the older snow patches will become firm and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight, then a brief period of rain and sleet will progressively turn to snow during the morning as a cold front moves over the area. Strong Southerly winds will back West-South-West during the day. The freezing level will be above the summits overnight then gradually lower to around 800 metres by the end of the forecast period.

Comments

A blustery day in prospect as winter returns. Snow becoming firm and icy with unfavourable runouts.
