

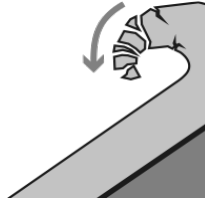

##### Avalanche Problems



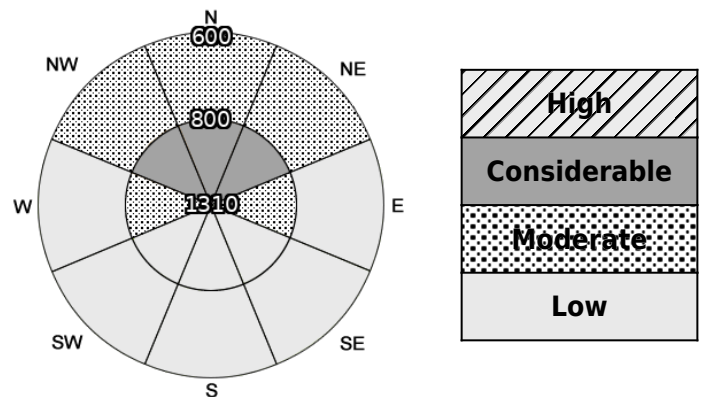
Wind Slab

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Significant accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will develop especially overnight on North-West to North-East aspects, this will be most widespread above 800 metres. West and East aspects will be affected by cross loading. Localised unstable windslab will develop on steep banks and burn lines below 800 metres. Cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight heavy snowfall is expected on gale to storm force South-South-Easterly winds. During the day, winds will veer to the South and ease to become strong to gale force, snowfall will continue but it will be lighter and more showery. The freezing level will average at around 800 metres.

##### Comments

Significant snowfall and drifting expected over the next 24 hours. This will be heaviest during the night.
