

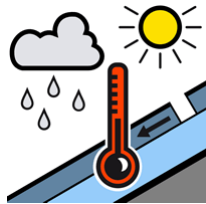

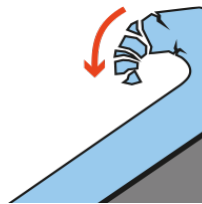

Wind Slab



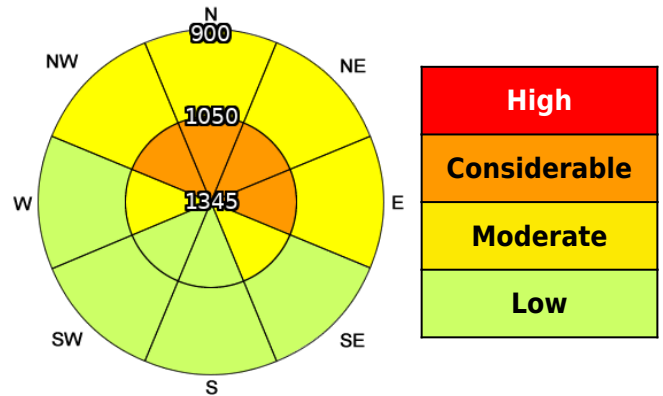

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Areas of unstable windslab will persist, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 1050 metres. Below this height stability will be better. During the afternoon wet snow instabilities will develop in all recent windslab. Some large and unstable cornices will remain above these aspects becoming more prone to collapse in the afternoon. Exposed windward aspects will generally be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Moderate South-Easterly winds overnight increasing through the day to become very strong by the end of the afternoon. Mainly dry, but a few snow showers on Monday evening and some light rain at the end of the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 900 metres overnight rising above the summits in the afternoon.

**Comments**

Remaining mild through Wednesday with heavy showers in the afternoon.
