

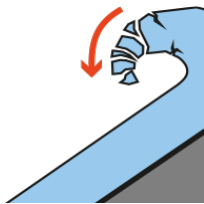

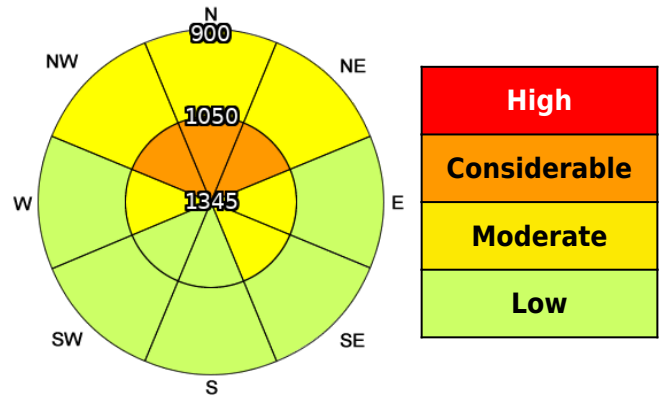

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wet snow instabilities will develop in recent windslab accumulations. North-West to North-East aspects above 1050 metres will be most affected with more localised instabilities on other aspects and at lower elevations. Greatest instability will be with the onset of rain overnight with some improvement during the day. Cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very mild conditions with rain at all levels. Strong South-Easterly winds will decrease slightly and veer Southerly. The freezing level will be around 2300 metres.

Comments

This is the penultimate avalanche forecast of the 25/26 season. The last forecast will be issued on Wednesday for Thursday. Milder conditions are forecast for the next few days.
