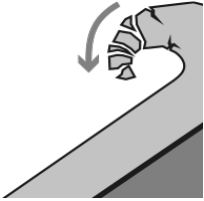

**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 16/04/2026**

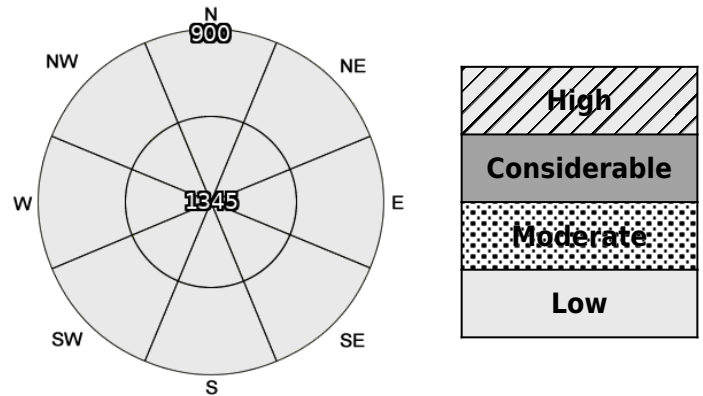
**Avalanche Problems**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing snowpack will continue to thaw and consolidate. Snowpack stability will be generally good. Cornices below the freezing level will remain fragile and may cause surface instability in the event of cornice collapse. Any new wet snow deposits on the highest summits are expected to be shallow and reasonably well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Showers will be rain at all levels initially, turning to wet summit snow as the freezing level falls to around 1200 metres overnight. Strong Southerly winds overnight will veer South-Westerly during the day.
