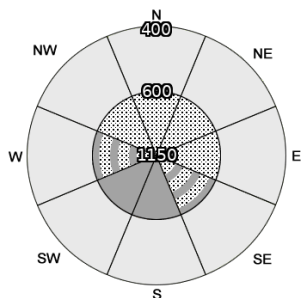


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Wed 06/01/2010 TO 18:00HRS Thu 07/01/2010



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

The cold Northerly airflow will continue overnight with very light snow flurries.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Unstable Windslab resting on weak layers will remain on mainly South to South-Westerly aspects above 600 meters with some unstable localised deposits on many other aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Wed 06/01/2010

Observed Weather Influences

There was moderate snow showers overnight with substantial transportation of snow on the North to North-Easterly winds. Today has been bright and clear with very light winds and continued low temperatures.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

New windslab accumulations have formed on South to West aspects above 600 metres. Field tests at 890 meters on a South-Easterly aspect produced failures due to weak layers in the snowpack. The avalanche hazard is Considerable

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions

Fantastic snow cover with very variable snow conditions off-piste.
