



Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New poorly bonded windslab will initially form on mainly South to Westerly aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely, then on North-West to Northerly aspects. Steep slopes, corrie rims and convexities will be most affected. Localised accumulations will be form on other aspects due to cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the wind will be strong North-Easterly with snowfall. During the day it will be dry and the winds will become moderate South-Easterly. The freezing level will be at 450 metres.
