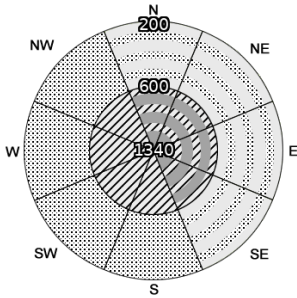


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Thu 25/02/2010 TO 18:00HRS Fri 26/02/2010



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh snow and strong Easterly winds will continue

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Areas of unstable snow will continue to form in locations sheltered from the Easterly winds. Greatest accumulations will be on South, West and North-West aspects above 600m. Avalanches will occur in these locations. Areas of unstable snow will also be present on other aspects. The avalanche hazard will be High

Observed Weather Influences

Heavy snow at all levels with strong Easterly winds

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Large areas of unstable snow are present on many aspects. Greatest accumulations are on South-West, West and North-West facing slopes and gullies above 600m. The avalanche hazard is High

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions

Fresh snow at all levels.
