

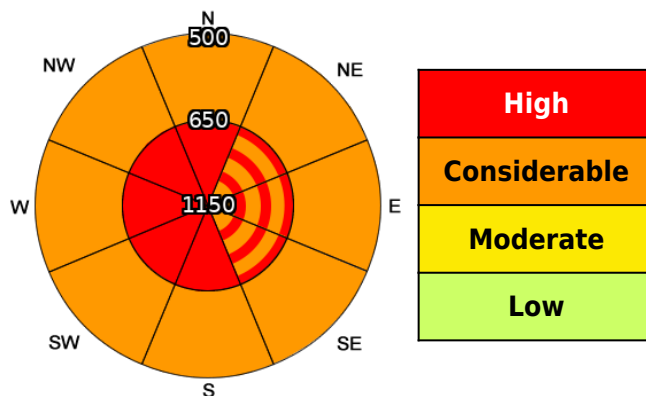
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE HIGH

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 26/02/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Avalanches will occur due to the intensity of the storm building a dense new weakly bonded wind slab on previously reported buried surface hoar and facet layers. Large avalanches can be expected to run into low angle terrain. Nearly all aspects and elevations above 500 metres will be affected. The avalanche hazard will be High



Forecast Weather Influences

Continued heavy snow will ease through Friday. The freezing level will be 300 metres with strong East to North-East winds becoming predominantly North-East.

Comments

Snow angels creating whomping triggers in the snowpack. Avalanche hazard extends beyond the recreation zone; watch for roof avalanches, cut banks and road side slopes.
