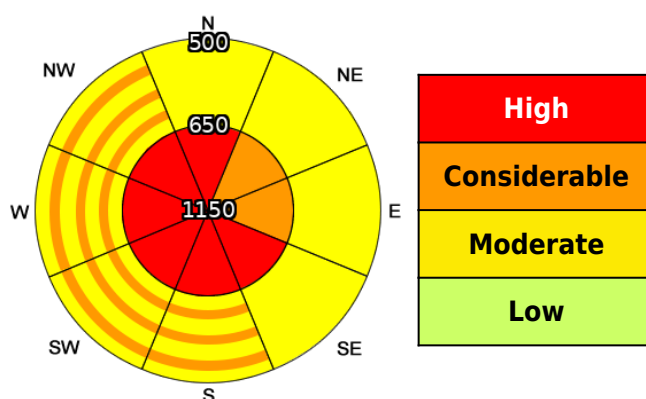


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE HIGH**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 28/02/2010****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Some drifting will take place and instabilities will persist in the weakly bonded slab due to the buried surface hoar and facet layers. Avalanches will occur on mainly Southerly through West to Northerly aspects above 650 metres. The avalanche hazard will be High.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

There is no precipitation forecast for the period with only a possible wintry shower. Winds will continue moderate North-East, with the freezing level dropping to about 450 metres.

Comments

Snowpack still needs some settlement time to recover from the storm cycle. Avalanche debris 2 metres deep was noted and one crossed the A93 road, about 4ml S of Braemar. Of particular concern is the potential for avalanches triggered by skiers or climbers above cornice lines and steep terrain.
