

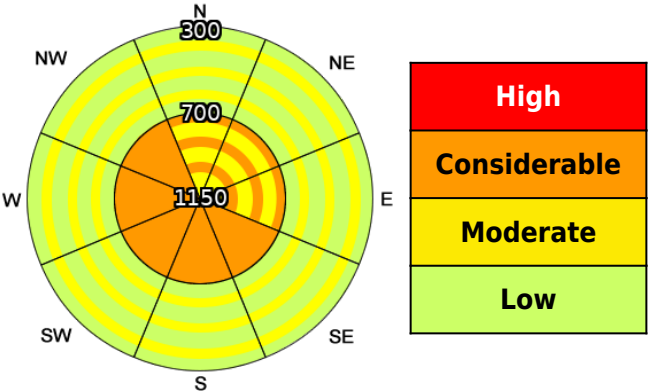
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 05/03/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Strong winds will form unstable accumulations of windslab in many sheltered gullies and hollows and on slopes with an East through South to South-West aspect mainly above 700 metres. Existing weakly bonded deposits will remain on other Westerly aspects. Steep scarp slopes summit gulleys and corniced areas will be particularly affected. Avalanches and cornice collapse are likely. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be new snow above 700 metres with rain and sleet below this level. Winds will be strong throughout the period from the North-North-West. The freezing level will be 900 metres.

Comments

Potential for weakly bonded windslab on a wide variety of aspects as strong winds re-distribute existing deposits.
