

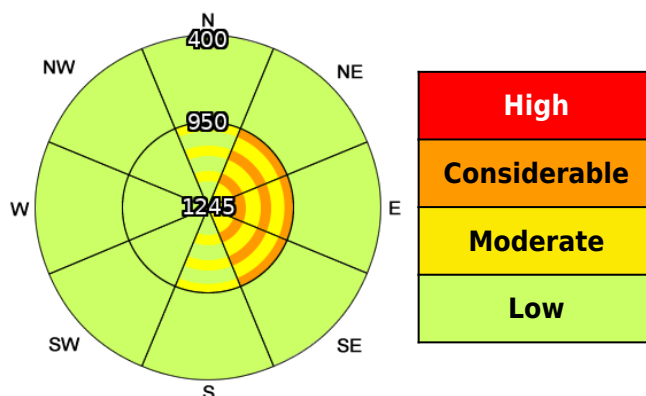

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 15/03/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised weakly bonded windslab accumulations will develop and areas most affected will be on steep and convex North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Cross loading will leave deposits in sheltered areas such as gully flanks and scarp slopes. Elsewhere the old snowpack will remain generally well bonded and stable. Existing cornices will weaken and be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight there will be snow showers on strong Westerly winds. On Monday it will clear as the wind speed decreases and veers to the North-West. The freezing level will rise to 1000 metres.
