

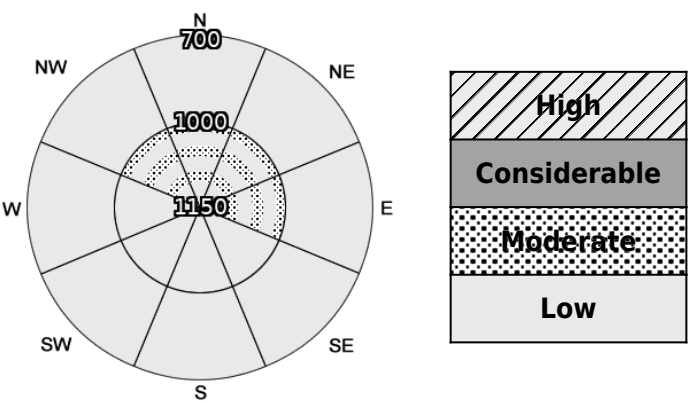

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of fresh windslab will be deposited on North-West through North to East aspects above 1000 metres. In general these are not expected to be significant, and should be avoidable. At lower levels the snowpack will continue to thaw and stability will generally be good. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers, which will fall as snow on the highest tops, will die out overnight to leave a dry morning. There will be a little light snow on the tops during the afternoon. Moderate to strong South-Westerly winds will veer to the South.

Comments

Rock and ice fall remains a hazard in the mild conditions.
