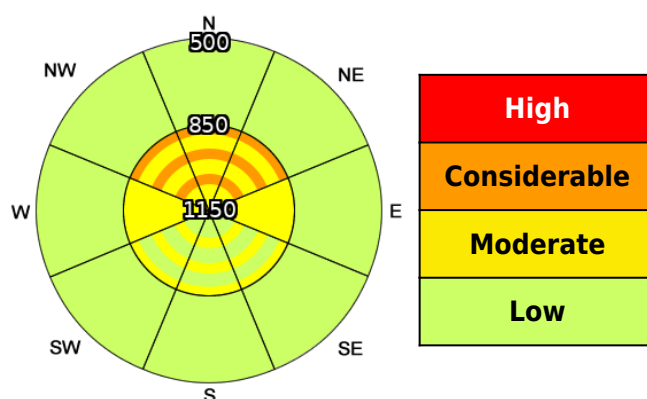


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 23/03/2010****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Isolated areas of weakly bonded wind slab will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 850 metres. The extent of this slab will be quite limited but gully exits and other slopes may be affected by cross loading. The mid to deeper snowpack will be reasonably stable with slightly cooler temperatures. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The weather forecast for the next few days is quite unsettled. The daytime freezing level will come down to around the 1100 metre level. There might be a light freeze overnight in clear breaks. Snow showers are expected above 850 metres, with winds from the South-west then Southerly.

Comments

Snowpack is becoming increasingly dense and coarse grained but still appears at depth to be reasonably stable. Some glide crack activity observed over the past couple of days on steep convex terrain.
