

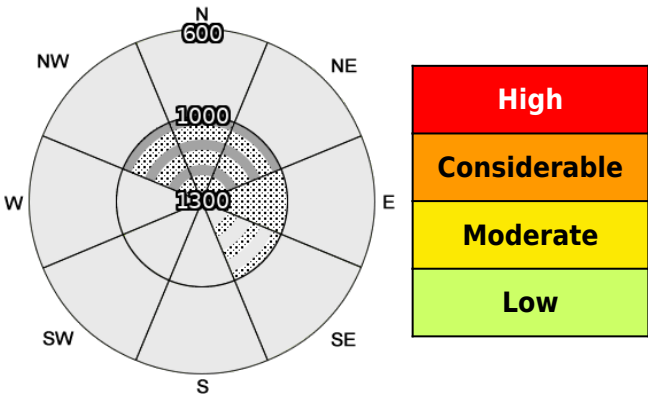
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 26/03/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will remain well bonded and stable on all aspects and at all levels during the day. New accumulations of fresh snow will start to build windslab on North to Easterly aspects mainly above 900 metres. Gully exits and Corrie rims being most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the freezing level will be above the summits and rain is expected with Easterly winds. During the day the variable wind will become strong South-Westerly, from around midday it will gradually become colder with snowfall falling at summit levels initially .
