

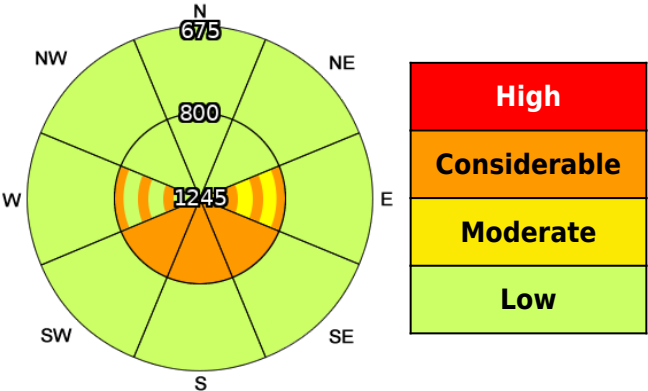

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Windslab accumulations will continue to build and avalanches are likely on steep South-East to South-West aspects above 800 metres. Localised weakly bonded deposits will also affect steep sheltered East and West aspects. Elsewhere the snowpack will remain well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers on strong North winds will continue through the night. During Monday the winds will decrease to moderate and veer to the North-East as snow showers become more isolated. The freezing level will be at 350 metres.

Comments

Cloud base down to 500 metres today. An unsettled wintry out look for the next few days.
