

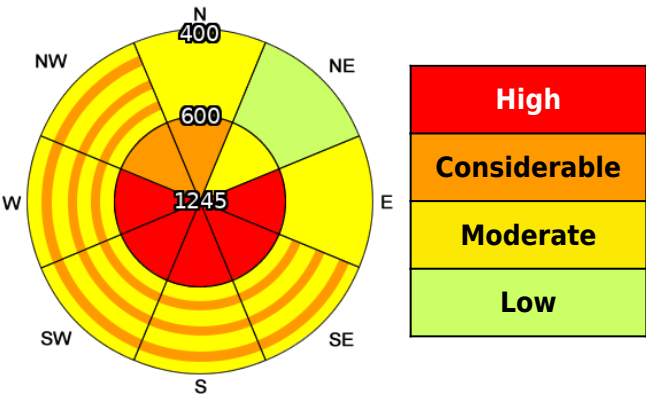

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 01/04/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Severe drifting of snow will continue to form unstable windslab on mainly South-East through South and West to North- Westerly aspects above 600 metres where avalanches will occur. Other aspects will be affected due to cross loading and remaining instabilities. Below 600 metres on most aspects localised unstable windslab is present in sheltered areas. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight and during the day the winds will be strong North-Westerly. Snowfall will be heavy but will lessen in the day. The freezing level will be at 400 metres in the night, rising to 600 metres in the day.

Comments

Waist deep drifts are common and chest deep wading in coire floors and valleys has been reported.
