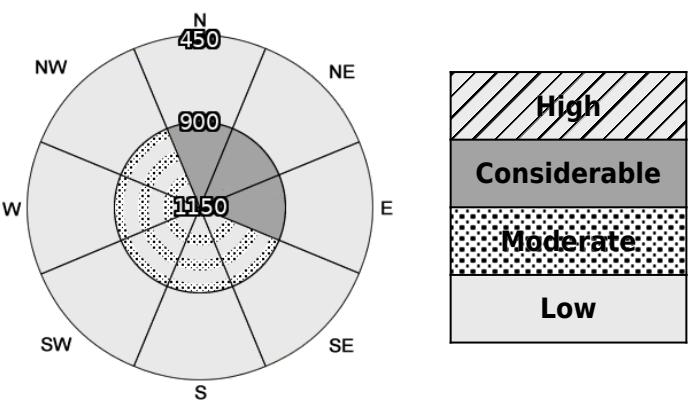


Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 08/04/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will initially be very wet . Mostly the snowpack will be soft and wet but will be generally stable, wet snow instabilities will exist in the most sheltered summit gullies and on steep North through East to South-Easterly aspects mainly above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard in these areas will be Considerable. Cornices will be prone to collapse.



Forecast Weather Influences

Heavy precipitation overnight will fall as sleet or wet snow on the highest slopes with rain at lower levels. On Thursday precipitation will be light with sleet and wet snow possible above 900 metres. Winds will be Westerly strong.

Comments

Wet overnight but becoming drier on Thursday.
