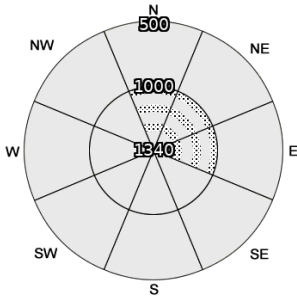


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Thu 08/04/2010 TO 18:00HRS Fri 09/04/2010



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Warm conditions are expected with the freezing level remaining above the summits and localised light rain.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to gradually thaw at all levels. Localised instabilities will be present on some steep slopes, mainly on North, North-East and East aspects above 1000m.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Thu 08/04/2010

Observed Weather Influences

Fairly dry today with the freezing level of around 1200m.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack is gradually thawing at all levels. Localised instabilities are present on steep North, North-East and East aspects above 1000m.
