

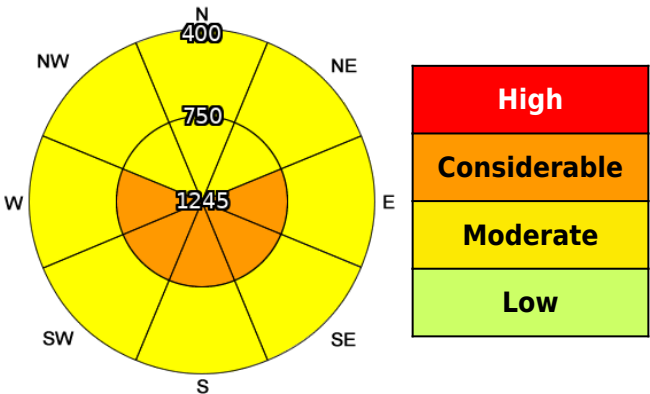

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of new weakly bonded windslab will continue to form on mainly South-East to South-Westerly aspects above 750 metres where avalanches are likely, Weakly bonded windslab will also exist on East and Westerly aspects due to cross loading. Gully flanks and exits in North facing corries will be affected. The old snowpack is firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight and during the day the wind will be strong North-Westerly with snow showers. Freezing at all levels.

Comments

Bitterly cold day with temps of -10 and 50mph winds. More snow and cold temps tomorrow.
