Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New drifted accumulations of soft unstable windslab will develop on mainly West to Southerly aspects above 800 metres and in particular in gully exits, flanks and corrie rims, this will lie on a layer of surface hoar and will be weakly bonded. Other aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight and during the day no precipitation is expected but moderate strength North-Easterly winds will affect the area.

Comments

Very firm snow ice in places which is sometimes masked by a new soft snow layer. Remaining cold. Good skiing and climbing to be had.
