

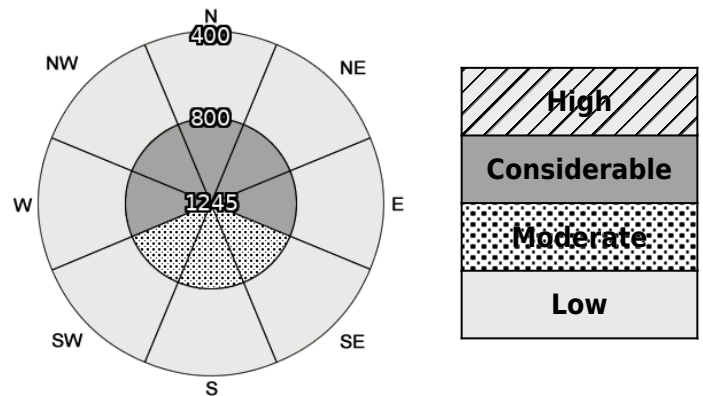

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 26/12/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting new snow will form unstable windslab on West through North to Easterly aspects mainly above 800 metres, increasing in amount during the afternoon where avalanches are likely. The new snow will be poorly bonded to the old snow surface. Gully exits and corrie rims in North facing corries will be especially affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the moderate West wind will become Southerly with no precipitation expected, during the day the winds will become strong Southerly with light snowfall initially. The freezing level will rise to 300 m during the day.

Comments

Persistent snowfall from dusk and through Sunday evening. Poor weather developing in the afternoon with very strong Southerly winds and drifting.
