

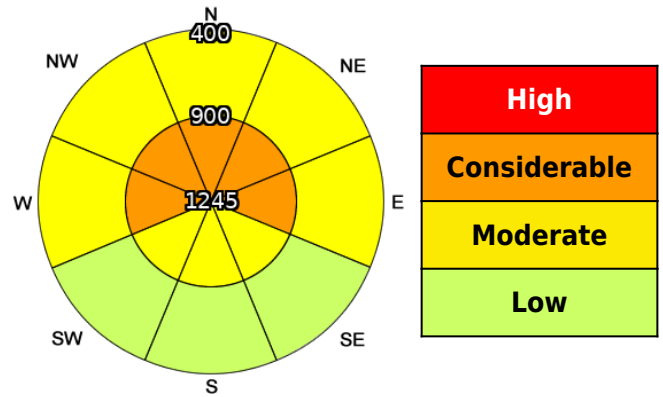

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 28/12/2010

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting will continue to build windslab on an already weakly bonded snowpack on mainly West through North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Gully exits, crag aprons and corrie rims will be particularly affected. Areas of scoured and stable old snow are evident on many aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Some light snowfall is expected overnight and during the morning. Winds will be strong South-Easterly and the freezing level at 300 metres will rise to 400 metres in the day.

Comments

Areas of old snow-ice are evident and provide good access - Good route finding skills are useful to avoid unstable areas of fresh new slab accumulations.
