

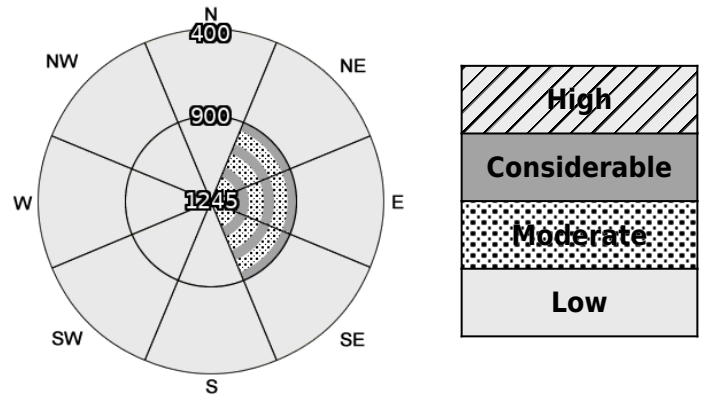

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 03/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack has refrozen and is generally well bonded and stable throughout. New snow accumulations later in the day will form poorly bonded windslab on mainly North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Corrie rims and gully flanks will be affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight and during the morning day it will be mainly dry, snowfall will develop later in the day. The Northerly winds will back Westerly in the night and become very strong as the day progresses. The freezing level will rise to 300 metres in the morning and then 1000 metres in the afternoon.

Comments

Hard snow pack, serious runouts. Snowpack has been covered with rime which makes travel on foot and ski a bit more secure than previous icy conditions.
