

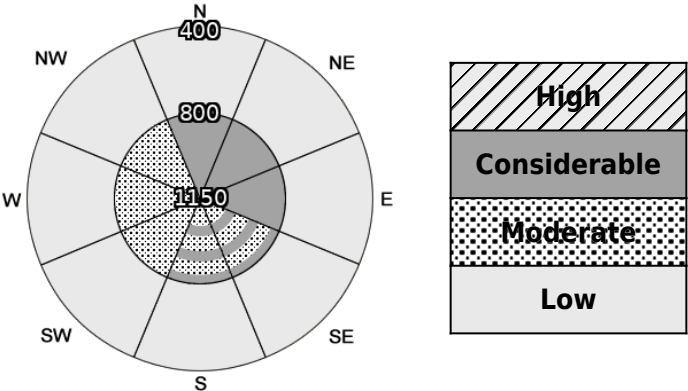

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 08/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New unstable deposits will develop on the arrival of new snow - expected after mid-day. Poorly bonded layered windslab will exist mainly on North through East to South aspects above 800 metres. The greatest accumulations will be in sheltered gullies and steep sheltered coire headwalls, cornices will also be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, it is expected to remain dry with light Easterly winds. During the day the winds will increase in strength becoming North-Westerly with some snow showers in the afternoon. It will remain below freezing at all levels through the period.

Comments

New snow amounts uncertain and may not arrive until late in the day. Buttresses and ridges are well plastered and the Glencoe ski-ing is good with fabulous views.
