

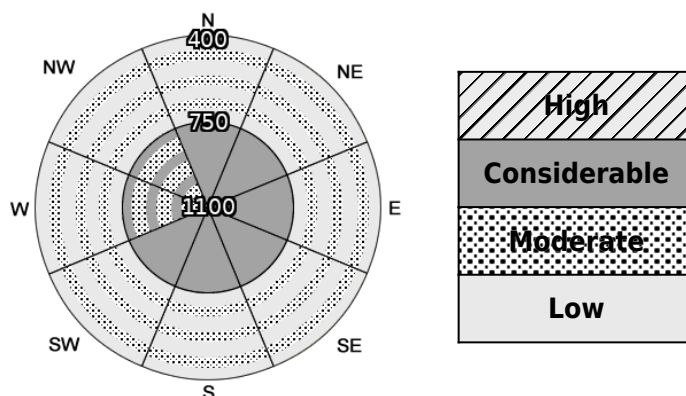
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 11/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Additional weakly bonded snow will be present on slopes of many aspects. Deepest and most widespread deposits will be on North through East to South-West aspects above 750m where avalanches are likely. Cross-loading of snow means pockets of localised instability will persist in other locations especially gully flanks and multi-aspect gully exits. All cornices will be fragile and prone to sudden collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snowfall overnight, dying out during the day. Winds will be light to moderate Northerly then North-Westerly, later Southerly. Temperatures will become progressively colder during the day.

Comments

Very poor visibility during Monday morning. Creag Meagaidh eerily quiet.
