

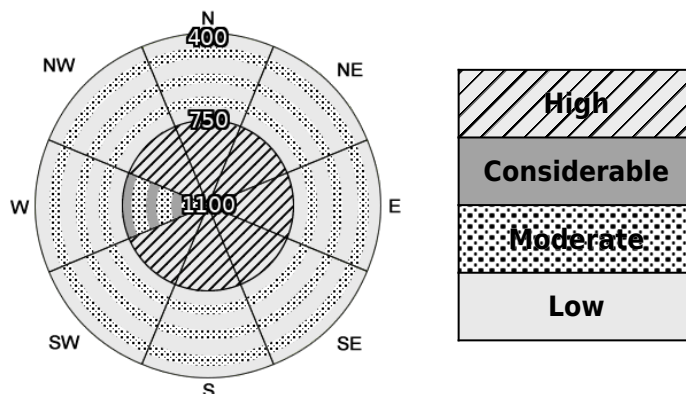
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE HIGH

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 12/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Additional snow overnight will further load weakly-bonded snow on North-West to North aspects; this in addition to the existing marginally bonded accumulations which are widespread on many aspects above 750 metres. A period of high instability will follow early on Wednesday and avalanches will occur on slopes of many aspects brought on by the onset of any rainfall and milder temperatures. Recently formed cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snowfall overnight, followed by milder temperatures and light rain early in the day. Winds initially South-Easterly will ease and become Southerly as the milder airflow becomes established.

Comments

Milder temps and any onset of rain will be accompanied by a period of high transitional instability.
