

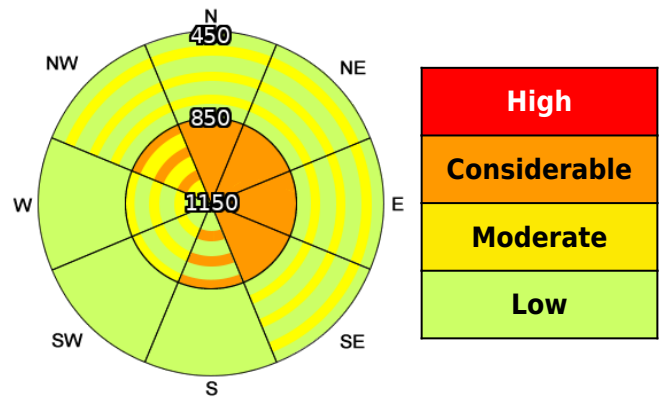

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 19/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight snow showers will continue to develop areas of weakly bonded windslab in sheltered locations this will be in addition to existing unstable deposits. The greatest accumulations will be above 850 metres on North through East to South-East aspects with some isolated and localised deposits on other aspects. Gullies and steep coire headwalls and exits will be particularly effected, cross loading due to strong winds will take place. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will continue overnight with strong North-Westerly winds these will give way to a dry day and decreasing winds that will back to South-Westerly. The freezing level will be around 750 metres.

Comments

It should be a much drier day BUT areas of unstable snow will still be present and caution is required on steep sheltered slopes and also in gullies.
