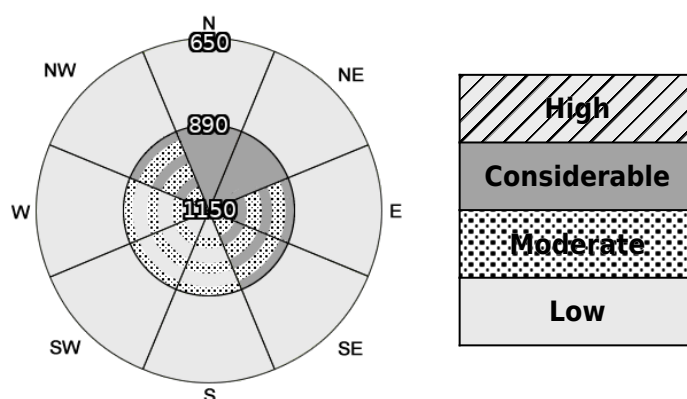


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 21/01/2011****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change is expected to the snowpack. Weakly bonded windslab deposits will still exist particularly on steeper slopes, gully exits and scarp slopes. The greatest accumulations will be present on North through East to South-East aspects, cornices will be fragile. Other aspects will also have some instabilities. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will remain generally dry with moderate North-Westerly winds the freezing level will rise to about 1100 metres. Lower glens might have an overnight frost.

Comments

The zero degree isotherm is forecast to rise, the rate at which it rises is unsure. The snowpack will become moist albeit slowly and not until the latter part of the day. Milder conditions and drizzle are expected during the week-end.
