

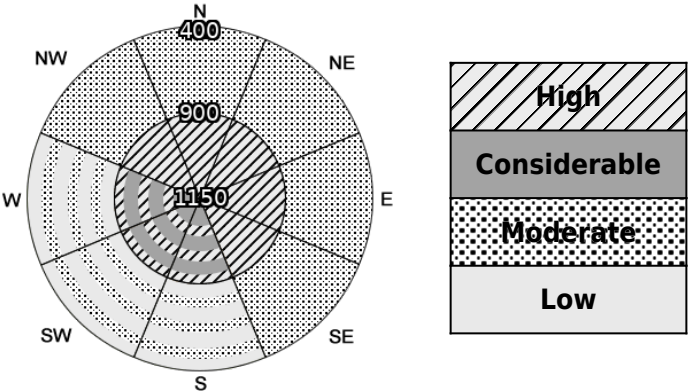

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 28/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snowpack stability will remain generally good as cold, dry and fairly calm conditions continue. Much of the snowpack will be firm and very icy, particularly on higher slopes and areas exposed to the recent strong Northerly and Easterly winds. Westerly winds through the period may form the odd pocket of windslab but these will generally be too shallow to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold and dry with fresh winds from a Westerly direction, the freezing level will be 400 metres overnight rising to 600 metres through the day.

Comments

Snowpack very firm and icy on many slopes some of which have serious run outs onto rocks. Conditions are quite limited due to lack of snow cover but what is there should give some sport.
