

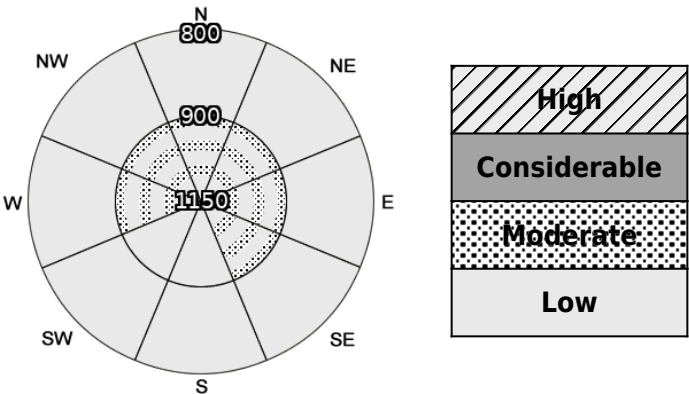

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 30/01/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The stability of the old snowpack will generally remain good but strong South-Westerly winds and light snow showers will form unstable accumulations of windslab around the tops of sheltered gullies, corniced areas and steep North to Easterly aspects mainly above 900 metres. Stability in these areas will become poor as they attain depth. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight with light snow later on Sunday. Winds will strengthen through the day becoming gale force for a time from a South-Westerly direction. The freezing level will be around 900 metres.

Comments

Snowpack should remain firm and icy on many slopes some of which have serious run outs onto exposed rocks. New snow not expected until later in the day and amounts not expected to be great.
