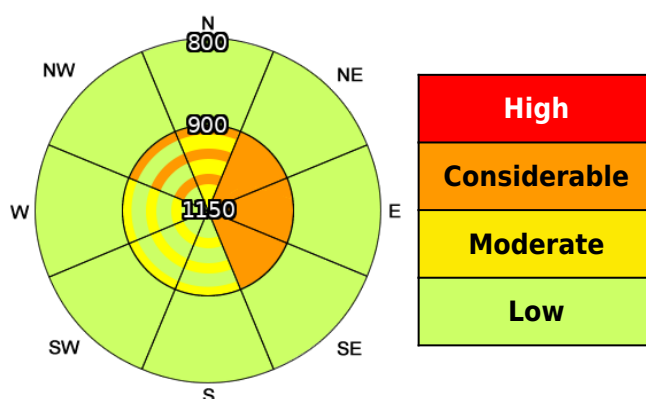


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 01/02/2011****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing wet snowpack will start to re-freeze through the day forming an icy surface in many areas. Where re-freeze occurs stability will generally become good. New snow and very strong winds will form unstable windslab in the most sheltered of areas. Summit gullies, corniced areas and slopes with a North through East to South-Easterly aspect mainly above 900 metres will be most affected, here avalanches are likely. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Precipitation will fall as heavy rain overnight turning to snow showers on Tuesday morning as the freezing level lowers to around 600 metres. Winds will be gale force mainly from the West.

Comments

A return to more Wintery weather. Exposed snow slopes will become firm and very icy with serious run outs onto rocks.
