

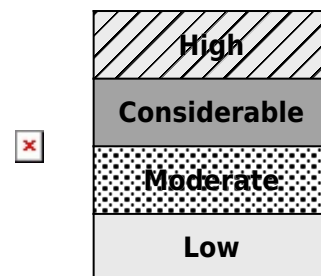

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 01/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow accumulations will form poorly bonded windslab on mainly North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Gully exits and flanks, corrie rims and scarp slopes will be most affected. Elsewhere the snowpack will re-freeze and will be well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the winds will remain very strong South-Westerly and precipitation is expected, falling as snow above 900 metres. In the day the winds will become strong Westerly and will be dry. The freezing level will lower to 600 metres in the day.

Comments

Snowpack will re-freeze and be hard and icy. Serious runouts onto rocks!
