#### Avalanche Problems

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will re-freeze in the colder temperatures and will be firm and stable. New snow deposits will form unstable windslab on mainly North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Gully exits, corrie rims and scarp slopes will be most affected. Other aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

#### Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, heavy snow showers are expected with strong Westerly winds, snowfall will die out for a time in the day but will return later. Winds will become South-South-Westerly and strengthen. Freezing level, 600 metres in the night and 700 metres in the daytime.
