

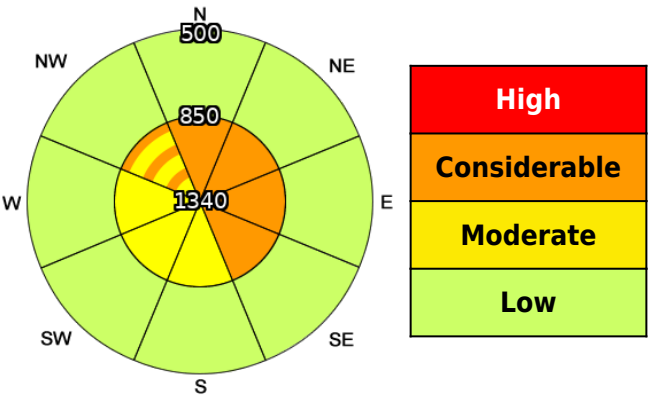

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 10/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing accumulations of windslab, which lie mainly on North-West through North and East to South-East aspects, will start to refreeze and consolidate in the cooler conditions but instabilities will remain on steep slopes. Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited in sheltered gullies, hollows and on slopes with mainly North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall above 650 metres is expected overnight with moderate Westerly winds. It is expected to be dry during the day with the freezing level around 900 metres and moderate South-Easterly winds.
