

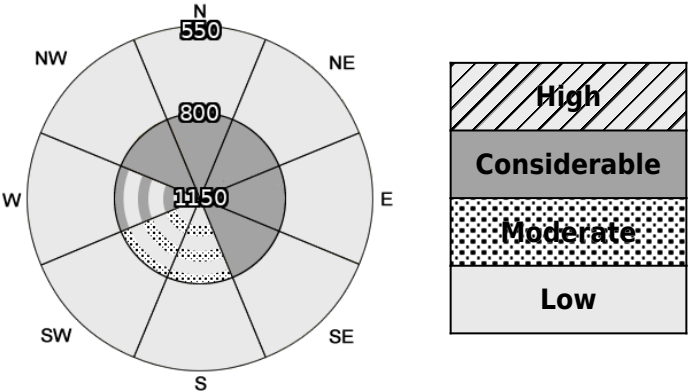
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 11/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At first new accumulations of poorly bonded snow will be deposited above 750 metres mostly on North-West to North-East aspects. As the freezing level rises and rain affects the area wet snow instabilities will exist on steep slopes on all aspects. North-West to North through to South-East slope aspects will be particularly effected and especially gully exits and flanks, cornices will also become unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight it will remain dry and generally cold with light variable winds these will increase becoming strong South-Easterly. The freezing level will be 750 metres. During the day the freezing level will slowly rise to 1150 metres with snow showers at first turning to persistent rain.

Comments

Snowpack will become moist and wet below 1000 metres.
