

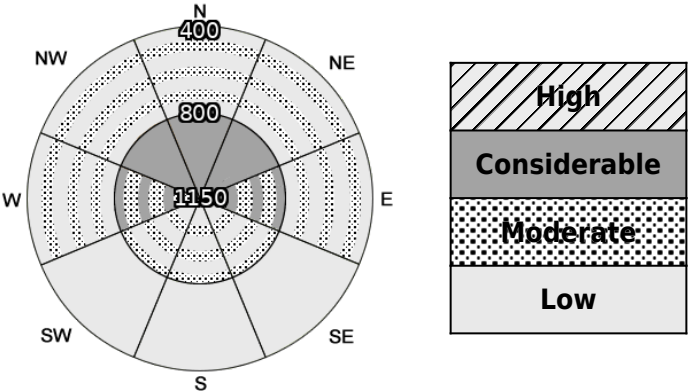

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 12/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The strong winds will instigate heavy drifting leading to new deposits of deep unstable windslab in sheltered locations. The greatest accumulations will be mainly above 800 metres on West through North to East aspects. Above 850 metres, steep scarp slopes, gullies and exits slopes will be particularly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight heavy snow showers and very strong South-East winds are expected with the freezing level at 600 metres. During the day it will be dry with winds decreasing and becoming South-Westerly.

Comments

Blizzard conditions are forecast for tonight above 400 metres bringing heavy snow showers. These should die out in the early hours giving a dry day.
