

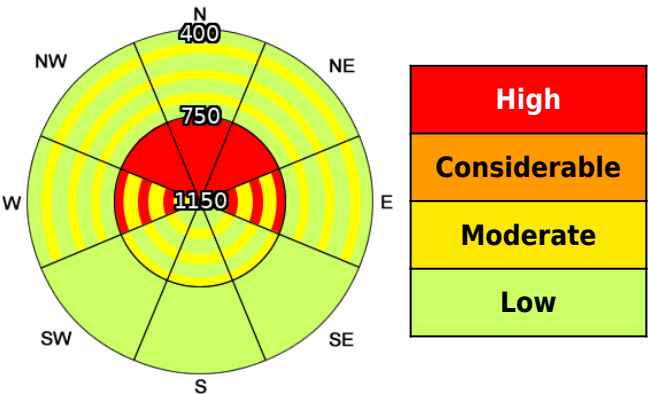

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 14/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack stability will be poor and avalanches will occur mainly but not solely on steep North-West to North-East slope aspects above 750 metres. Sheltered gullies, scarp slopes and steep corrie headwalls will be particularly affected. Other aspects will also have isolated unstable deposits due to cross loading and newly formed cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will continue, becoming more persistent and heavy at times during the day with fresh South-Easterly winds. Winds could be stronger at times.

Comments

Areas of deep unstable snow is present on many steep slopes and great caution is required. In some locations only a slight additional load will be enough to trigger an avalanche.
