



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 15/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow accumulations arriving with cooler temperatures will be weakly bonded to the existing snow surface. The deep accumulations formed in the past few days are likely to avalanche, especially on steep convex terrain above 850 metres, mainly North-West through North to North-Easterly aspects, triggers, including cornice failure are likely. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snow showers are forecast with slightly cooler temperatures, so the snow line will be about 500 metres. Winds will be up to 40 mph from the South backing South-East later.

Comments

Net snow accumulations of the past few days are still a bit of a worry in high exit climb terrain, running into low angle areas with long runouts.
