

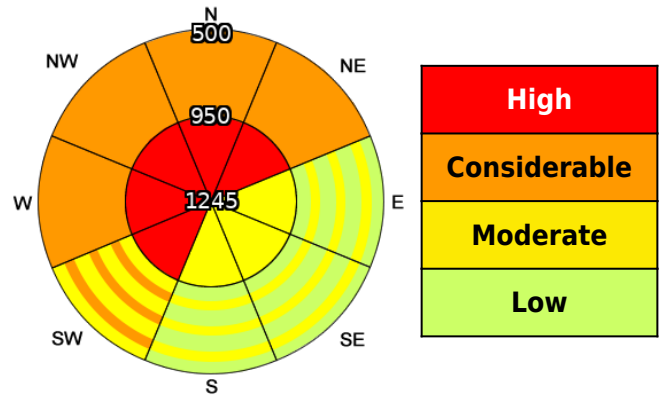

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 16/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Severe drifting will continue to form weakly bonded windslab onto mainly South-West through North to North-Easterly aspects where avalanches will occur, on these aspects poorly bonded windslab will also form in steep areas and sheltered locations to lower levels. Unstable deposits will also form on other aspects due to cross loading. Cornices which have recently formed will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight and during the day very strong South-East to Easterly winds will continue. Snow showers are expected throughout the forecast period with heavy snowfall at times, dying out in the afternoon. The freezing level will be between 600 to 750 metres.

Comments

Severe drifting will continue, good route finding in mountainous terrain recommended.
