



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 17/02/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At lower elevations the snowpack will continue to stabilise and will be moderately well bonded on the steepest locations. Some light drifting will continue to load the poorly bonded windslab deposits that are present on mainly South-West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 950 metres where avalanches are likely. Other aspects will be affected due to cross loading. Cornices above West to Northerly facing slopes will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, winds will be moderate to light variable South-Easterly which will become South-South-Easterly in the day. Light snow showers overnight will die out in the day. The freezing level will be at 800 metres.

Comments

A less windy and brighter day in prospect. Good route finding in Mountain terrain recommended.
