Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Significant drifting will continue to load the poorly bonded windslab deposits that are present on mainly South-West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 950 metres where avalanches are likely. Cornices above West through North to North East facing corrie rims will remain unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the wind will be South-South-Easterly 35mph increasing throughout the day to 80mph. There will be some snow showers. The freezing level will be 700m falling to 500m.

Comments

Approaches to cliffs require careful route choice. There are large soft cornices around the corrie rims.
