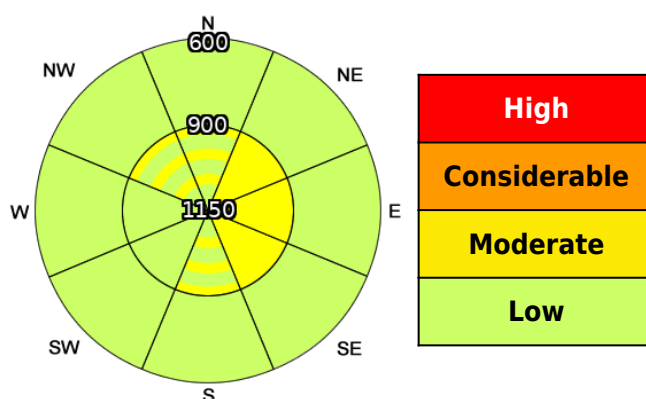


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 28/02/2011****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Localised windslab deposits will exist in sheltered locations with the greatest accumulations on North-East through East to South aspects, mainly above 900 metres. The deepest accumulations and areas particularly affected are likely to be sheltered gullies and gully exits due to cross loading. Many other slopes will be firm and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It should remain dry with Northerly winds with the freezing level at around 800 metres.

Comments

A ridge of high pressure will bring dry and more settled conditions starting with a frost in the glens. Should be plenty of sunshine tomorrow with light northerly winds. A good dry to be out climbing or ski-ing.
