

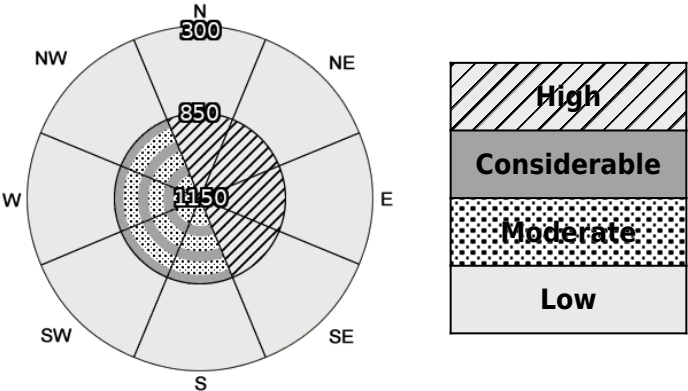

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 01/03/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

As the freezing level rises during the day the snowpack will slowly become moist and surface wet snow instabilities will increase. Above 900 metres mainly on North through to East to South-East aspects localised deposits of moderately bonded snow will remain, especially on steeper slopes. Cornices will also become unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It should remain generally dry overnight with light South-Westerly winds with the freezing level at 1000 metres. Dry conditions will continue through the day with the freezing level rising to above the summits, the winds will increase and veer to the North-West for a time before returning to the South-West.

Comments

Some drizzle or low cloud could affect the area during the night but should clear by morning. Summit temperatures are forecast to be plus 2 - 4 degrees.
