

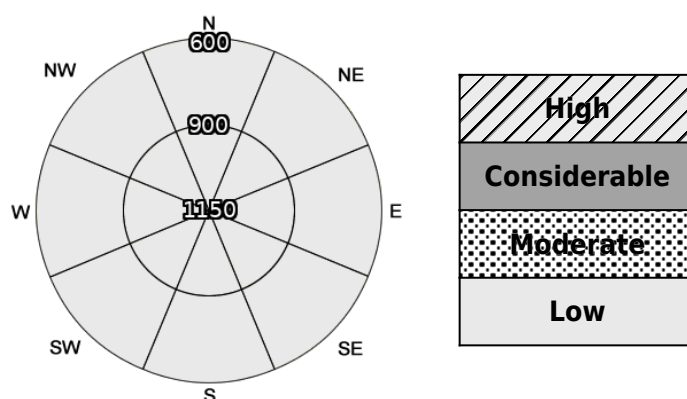

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack is already generally stable and well bonded. Little will change. On aspects exposed to direct sunlight softening may occur during the day resulting in isolated areas of surface instability on steep slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight winds will be South-Westerly 15 mph and the freezing level will be 1300 metres. Friday will be dry, winds Westerly 20 mph and the summit temperatures will be plus 2 degrees.

Comments

Snow cover for ski touring varies tremendously on different hills. Easy access to good touring (more or less from road) to West of Glenshee Ski Centre. Rumours of colder weather in the not too distant future!
