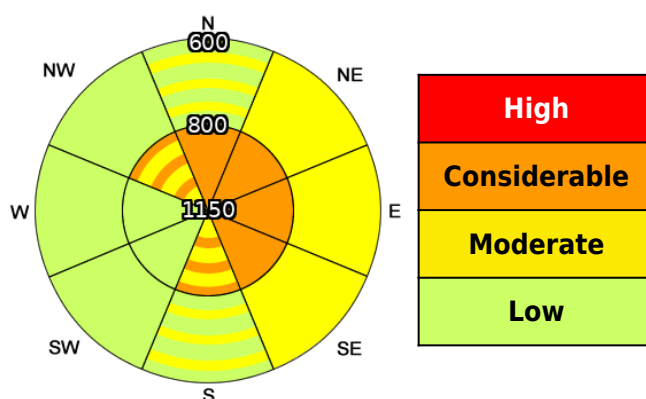


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 09/03/2011****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing snowpack will consolidate at all levels as the temperature falls. However there will be new accumulations of poorly bonded windslab on mainly North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Cross loading will affect other aspects. Cornices will continue to build. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Significant overnight snow will be accompanied by very strong Westerly winds with a freezing level around 500 metres, lowering to 300 metres in the day. Frequent snow showers will become more persistent as the day progresses. Winds will be very strong Westerly.
