

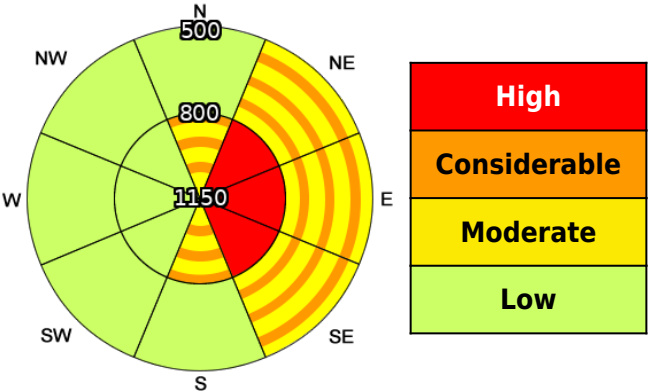

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 10/03/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop in sheltered locations on mainly North-East to South-East aspects above 800 meters where avalanches will occur. Other aspects will continue to be affected due to cross loading, gully exits and sheltered scarp slopes most affected. Newly formed cornices will also be a hazard. Wind exposed aspects will be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight there will be moderate amounts of snowfall above 900 meters then snow showers to 400 meters during the day. Winds will remain strong Westerly.

Comments

Significant drifts are starting to build in many sheltered locations although these are mostly avoidable.
